The Telehealth Initiative

Supporting physicians nationwide in optimizing and sustaining telehealth to ensure all practices are operating efficiently and facilitating positive experiences for both patients and physicians.







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The world around us has recognized the importance of telehealth.

Overview

The Academy of Medicine of Cleveland & Northern Ohio (AMCNO) is collaborating with the Physicians Foundation (PF) and the American Medical Association (AMA), to support physicians interested in sustaining telehealth and measuring its impact in their practices. Each participating association will select 5-8 practices interested in continuing to leverage telehealth to improve the patient experience and provide access for patients to their physicians via this mode of care delivery for continued continuity of care with their physician.

This opportunity is open to all types of physician practices and requires a 12 to 16-month commitment. Practices can be any size. Interested practices should contact AMCNO Communications Director Tara Camera at property of the practices.

Provided to the practice site

By participating in this initiative, each practice site will gain access to the following:

- Existing educational resources from the AMA, TMA, FMA, and MMS developed as part of cohort 1 of the initiative.
- Expert mentoring from FMA, TMA and AMA to discuss optimizing and sustaining telehealth into their practice.
- Access to the Telehealth Immersion Program, an
 educational program designed to support physicians,
 practices, and health systems optimize and sustain
 telehealth at their organizations. This program provides
 virtual events and discussions focused on the
 application of telehealth in a variety of settings and
 offers a network for physicians and care teams to share
 experiences using telehealth and best practices.
- Dissemination of the Telehealth Survey. This will include questions focused on practice/physician experience using telehealth. An overall survey report of results and summary-level data will be provided.
- The AMA Return on Health framework and a method for collecting and contributing data to support the future of telehealth.

Practice site accountability and commitment

The Telehealth Initiative requires a 12 to 16-month commitment from each practice site. The following outline provides expectations for each practice site upon confirmed participation.

Leadership Support

Each practice site shall submit a Statement of Interest and Support to the Academy of Medicine of Cleveland & N. Ohio. Statement will include an acknowledgement of support from practice site Chief Executive Officer or other relevant leaders. A template will be provided as part of the recruitment materials.

Identify Project Lead(s) and Core Project Team

Each practice site shall identify a core project team that includes both a clinician and administrative lead. Core project team will be responsible for meeting key deliverables, preparing progress reports to their medical association, and ensuring timely project deliverables.

Costs

Each participating practice will receive a \$1,500 stipend to participate. The AMCNO will provide learning materials, coaching guidance, and a method for data collection (i.e. CME, PICME, or MOC) to be reimbursed through a grant from The Physicians Foundation. Each practice site will be responsible for costs of ongoing use of telehealth including software and necessary IT personnel to facilitate technology set-up/maintenance and integration as needed.

Project Planning

Each association will develop a project outline and complete a project work plan for the measuring the value of virtual care. Teams will clearly delineate and identify team responsibilities and will develop a 12-month timeline for execution and completion of their project to collect practice data on the value of telehealth. Each practice will also be responsible for identifying a plan for how they will pull and track data at the practice level. A completed planning document should be shared with the medical association and the AMA. At the project's conclusion, each practice site will provide a written final narrative (template will be provided) to highlight lessons learned, describe outcomes, and identify additional opportunities for process improvement (possible to be part of CME activity).

Data Collection

In addition to participation in the Telehealth Survey, practice project teams will collect baseline, mid-point, and final data points to measure the impact of telehealth in their practices using the Return on Health framework. Data will be collected through a CME, PICME, MOC activity or other approach as identified and developed by the association.

In addition, a post-program interview will be completed to share learnings and best practices. The collective data and all learnings will be developed into an evidence base that may be shared with the larger medical community via the AMA and PF.

Written Status Updates

Practices will provide written status updates to the medical association every two months. These status updates are meant to be informative rather than evaluative.

Mentoring

In addition to support from the Academy of Medicine of Cleveland and N. Ohio, practice site teams will have access to mentoring from Florida Medical Association and Texas Medical Association on an as needed basis in addition to Telehealth Immersion Sessions coordinated by the AMA.
